

15. SIGNAGE

15.1 Posting of Signs

15.1.1 A responsible person must display or ensure the display of a sign, including any necessary symbols, noting any prohibitions or other necessary information in a conspicuous position at all times:

- a) at the main entrance to a Public Building
- b) at the main entrance to a Park;
- c) at the main entrance to a Public Municipal Open Space;
- d) at the main entrance to a School Yard;
- e) at the main entrance to a Cemetery;
- f) at a Transit Shelter or Bus Stop

Suggested symbols are attached as *Schedule A*.

15.2 No Smoking Signs

15.2.1 A no-smoking sign shall state

- a) the phrase “no smoking or vaping”, or
- b) a graphic symbol substantially in the form shown on Schedule “A” attached to this Bylaw, which shall be a minimum of six centimeters in diameter, and
- c) may include the words “The Village of Salmo Park Regulation Bylaw 700”.

15.3 No person shall remove, alter, conceal, deface, write upon or destroy any sign posted pursuant to this bylaw.

16. ENFORCEMENT

16.1 This Bylaw is designated under the *Community Charter* as a bylaw that may be enforced by means of a Bylaw Notice.

16.2 Bylaw Enforcement Officers are designated to enforce this Bylaw by means of a Bylaw Notice under the *Community Charter*.

16.3 No person may obstruct a Bylaw Enforcement Officer in the fulfillment of his or her duties under this Bylaw.

- 16.4 Without limiting the enforcement options under section 15.1, a person who commits an offence under this Bylaw will be liable to a penalty established under Section 17.2 of this Bylaw.

17. CONTRAVENTION & PENALTIES

17.1 Bylaw Contravention

17.1.1 Any person who:

- a) contravenes or fails to comply with this Bylaw;
- b) permits, suffers or allows any act or thing to be done in contravention of this Bylaw;
- c) fails to carry out an order made under this Bylaw; or
- d) fails or neglects to do anything required under a permit issued by the Village in respect of this Bylaw, commits an offence of this Bylaw and each day such offence continues or is permitted to continue will constitute a separate offence.

17.2 Notwithstanding any remedy in damages otherwise available to the Village:

- a) on being found guilty of an offence under this Bylaw, a person will be liable to pay a fine of up to \$10,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both, such fine and imprisonment and in default of payment of the fine to imprisonment for an additional term not exceeding six months under the *Offence Act*, and
- b) any vehicle which is removed, impounded or detained pursuant to this Bylaw shall remain impounded or detained until the owner thereof shall have paid to the Chief Administrative Officer of the Village of Salmo a fee of ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) plus actual costs and expenses paid by the Village for such removal, detention and impounding, which amount may be recovered by the Village by sale of the vehicle at public auction if not paid by the owner within fourteen (14) days.

18. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Bylaw or any other Bylaw of the Village to the contrary, the officers, officials and employees of the Village, while in the exercise of their duties, shall be exempt from the provisions hereof.

19. Village of Salmo Parks Regulations Bylaw 410, 1995, and all amendments thereto are hereby repealed and replaced by Bylaw #700.
20. This Bylaw shall be cited for all purposes as “Village of Salmo Parks & Publicly Owned Spaces Regulations Bylaw #700, 2019”.
21. This Bylaw shall come into force and effect upon final adoption by Council.

Equipment Repairs & Maintenance

- Ongoing fleet maintenance.
- Preparation and fleet maintenance for spring and summer equipment.

Waste Water

- Weekly cleaning of lift station to ensure all equipment is working correctly.
- Ongoing regular maintenance.
- Clean Water Wastewater grant and project in progress. Lift station construction is ongoing and currently 60% complete with the new electrical and SCADA systems currently being installed. Transfer to new system and sewer main connection anticipated within the first two weeks of April with forecasts for this portion of the project being completed by the end of April.
- WWTP Upgrade project starting. Project recently awarded. Construction to start as soon as the weather and ground melt allows.

Water

- Routine weekly samples are being sent in and have all come back well within parameters.
- Crew followed up on six reported and/or suspected water leaks and determined that they are not leaks.
- New motor installed at Sayward.
- New software upgrade at Sayward Well.

Parks & Campground

- Campground still closed for the season.
- Prepping washrooms and campground for opening.
- Installed new auto-locking door handles on KP Washroom doors.

Village Maintenance

- Snow Removal.
- Budget and planning for upcoming summer season projects.
- Fill pot holes.
- Clean out clogged and frozen drains.
- WorkSafe Compliance in developing a confined space policy ongoing.
- Started the marking of all of the Village hand tools.

Since the last report on January 1st, 2019 the Salmo Fire Department has responded to 10 calls:

1	Fire Alarms	1	Chimney Fires	6	Jaws Calls
1	Lift Assist	1	Burn Complaint		

DESCRIPTION

We were kept busy on January 22nd, with two calls coming in within 20 minutes of each other. As crews were arriving at a motor vehicle incident on the Bombi, we also received a call for a large plume of smoke coming from near a house. Fortunately we had sufficient manpower to deal with both calls at the same time.

This year we are looking at having to replace several sets of turn out gear and a fair number of our fire hoses. Both these items have a ten year life span, beginning on the date they were manufactured, according to the WorkSafe BC standards. Purchasing these items too early would reduce the number of serviceable years of these items.

Our roster of members is very strong at the moment with 25 shown on the books. We had one member retire after putting in several years of dedicated service. Another member has moved back into the area, and has rejoined the department, while another person has just recently joined our department. We still have one of the most active fire departments in the area, with a turnout of members that is the envy of all our neighbours.

TRAINING

We have restarted our training with the College of the Rockies. Our goal is to meet the standards set out by the Province of BC in their Playbook regulations. The more senior members have 4 chapters to review and to be tested on in front of an outside adjudicator, and then to be skill tested on one of those chapters by another outside adjudicator to get their exterior qualifications. After that we will be bringing in an outside trainer to teach the material to the rest of the firefighters. Once that is completed, we will all train together to gain our interior firefighter qualification.

We have been reviewing our practical hands on training through the winter and working towards our exterior qualifications. We have also held a practice where we put the new battery powered Jaws tool to work in cutting apart a vehicle (this tool will be invaluable for our over the bank extrications, and at times when a rapid extrication is required).
