Tim Clarke, Salmo Cannabis Re: Limit on **Number of Cannabis** Retail Stores - #66

Tim Clarke presented information regarding the cannabis store market. He noted that municipalities are the only government that can cap the number of cannabis stores, and cited studies that have indicated that the sustainable level of stores is 1:7,500-9,000 people. He presented information that in some areas the market is oversaturated and many stores are closing. He further noted that cannabis stores have relatively high start up costs due to extensive licensing requirements that can advantage large corporations with substantial financial backing. He said that locally-owned shops make up only about 10% of the market, and that large corporations can afford to undercut local stores in order to gain market share at the expense of locally-owned shops that can be

driven out of business.
