POSITION SUMMARY

This research project aims to better understand the demand for public transit services and to clearly identify the core user group(s) and their needs within Salmo and Area G. The results of this research will inform routing and delivery mechanism of a future Salmo and Area G Transit Service.

This student internship is specifically designed for students to:

- Transfer their understanding of concepts and skills learned in class to real life projects
- Develop professional competencies related to their course of studies

Under the co-supervision of the Researcher and the client, the intern will:

- Conduct a desktop analysis of demographics and travel pattern data (results to be compiled in Excel)
- Contribute to the development of a resident survey
- Implement delivery of the resident survey:
 - Online (survey monkey)
 - In-person (attending events)
- Analysis of survey results (results to be compiled in Excel)
- Summary of combined results
 - Presented in a Power Point presentation
 - Written executive summary
- Other assigned duties aimed at helping the client.

The ideal candidate is a career-oriented individual who is looking to gain valuable work experience and networking opportunities. The role will be based at Selkirk Innovates, Selkirk College's department that focuses on Applied Research and Innovation. In addition to fulfilling their research responsibilities, the intern will support the department's operations and/or interdepartmental collaborations.





This internship will take place in a combination of in-person and virtually. Some in-person work on site in Salmo (at the Village office or another location as directed) is required.

The successful applicant will be required to enroll in the Selkirk Innovates applied research internship training program, which currently does not have a fee. Applicants may be offered a position on an eligibility list to fill similar positions if available.
